Right There Questions

To create/answer these questions you need to go back to directly back to the passage and find the correct information to create/answer a question. The correct answer can be found somewhere in the passage.

These questions include some beginnings like...

"According to the passage..."

"How many..."

"Who is..."

"Where is..."

"What is..."



Strategies to create/answer these questions are...

- Skim or reread
- scan
- look for key words

Think and Search Questions

To create/answer these questions you need to think about how ideas and/or information in the passage relate to each other. Look back at the passage, find the information that the question refers to, and then think about how the information or ideas fit together.

These questions include some beginnings like...

"The main idea of the passage..."

"What caused..."

"Compare/contrast..."

"For what reason..."

"Are there any clues..."

"What information do we find out..."



Strategies to create/answer these questions are...

- Skim or reread
- Look for important information
- Summarize

"In My Head" Questions!!!

Author and You Questions

To create/answer these questions you need to use ideas and information that is not in the reading. They require you to think about what you have read, what you already know, and show how it all fits together. These answers will not be found in the text!!

These questions include some beginnings like...

"The author hints..."

"The passage suggests..."

"The speaker's attitude..."

"Would you have made the same choice as..."

"Do you agree with..."

"What did you think of..."

"What was something that really surprised..."



Strategies to create/answer these questions are...

- Reread
- Think about what you already know and what the author says
- Predict

On My Own Questions

To create/answer these questions you need to use your background knowledge on a topic. The answers will not be found in the text!! You don't even have to read the story!

These questions include some beginnings like...

"In your opinion..."

"Based on your own experience..."

"Think about someone/something you know..."

"Have you ever..."

"What's a decision you've had to..."

"Can you tell about a time..."

"How do you think you would feel..."



Strategies to create/answer these questions are...

- think about what you already know
- think about what you've read before
- make connections
